How we used technology to empower New Zealand colleagues

Fjords, hot springs, and Hobbiton: New Zealand is known for its stunning beauty, South Pacific location and as the home of Lord of the Rings.

But did you know that New Zealand also has more than 70 Aon offices? And together they grow 10% every year, and have for 20 years?

Our brokers and colleagues across New Zealand have created massive business opportunities and wins. That required a technology transformation to power them. The New Zealand network access used to be slow, unreliable, and new connections took months to deploy.

No more. Over the past 2 years, New Zealand network services have transformed.

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The challenge

Our New Zealand clients are highly diverse, across corporations, small to medium businesses, rural and urban, and numerous specialties. As a result, brokers are constantly in the field, visiting clients and prospects face-to-face, in order to provide insurance strategies and solutions.

That means a lot of driving, across far flung locations. That also means a need for wireless, connected technology that works for our colleagues.

"Our business worked in partnership with our technology colleagues to better understand our needs and challenges, and this was the start of a major transformation to support our business," said **Iain Tulloch**, Deputing Managing Director of Commercial Risk in Auckland.

The solution

As part of the global Core to Edge program, the **initiative that's transforming Aon's network**, our technology experts in **Aon Business Services (ABS)** worked in partnership with our New Zealand IT and business teams to enhance the network backbone by increasing bandwidth from 160 mbps to 2,640 mbps (+1,550%) for our New Zealand offices and the Trans-Tasman link that connects New Zealand with Australia.

And our technology teams also went further. Knowing the unique way that New Zealand colleagues conduct business, they developed a local technology strategy that included:

- Colleague and Guest WiFi that works, across all offices
- Cellular networks to connect offices (and provide backup connections)
- Devices for colleagues to work more effectively from home (RAP devices)
- Mobile hubs of standing desks at every office, where visiting and local brokers can dock their laptops and access all their work
- Cloud-based apps that connect brokers no matter where they are
- Updates that are reliably backed up and disaster-proof
- Increased rollout of Video Conferencing, now in 15 offices across the country
- Enhancing our voice services platform

"We partnered with the global technology teams to leverage their enterprise Core to Edge strategy, and they were able to adapt it to our local business needs," said **Jonathan Cook**, Head of IT in Auckland. "This gives us the power to keep growing."

The results

New Zealand colleagues now have huge increases in productivity and speed, along with a web of connections around the country.

"The partnership with Jonathan and his team, along with alignment



to the New Zealand business, allowed us to unleash the capabilities of Core to Edge to deliver significantly greater bandwidth, at lower costs, while providing future network agility and enabling their growth," said **Munu Gandhi**, VP Core Infrastructure Services.

"By standardizing and improving the day-to-day technology our colleagues use, as well as developing our mobile strategy, we are now serving our clients better," Iain said.

You've seen the images: Wildfires raging across California and the western U.S., cutting a wide swath of devastation for homeowners, property owners, businesses and the environment. The risk for wildfires grows each year due to the toxic mix of climate change, dry conditions and the Santa Ana winds.

Wildfires can be catastrophic for our clients. Last year alone, we saw more than US \$12 billion in losses. And the risk only grows each year.

Covering our clients for wildfire risk is a major challenge. But with the power of Aon United behind us, we're facing this challenge head on. As one client, the Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD), learned first hand.

The risk

SMUD has powered central California with energy and electricity for more than 70 years. It's one of the ten largest publicly owned utilities in the U.S., and they pride themselves on offering their community's homeowners, renters, and businesses complete energy solutions.

The company continues to innovate and grow their services, building thousands of miles of power lines for more than 2 million customers. Growing poses a tremendous risk, however: By delivering electricity to this part of the country, their lines could accidentally become the ignition source of a wildfire.

The challenge

As SMUD has grown, we've responded, helping them find the right insurance and risk management for their needs and cost limitations.

But as the risk for wildfires grows every summer, the insurance markets are feeling the squeeze. We were finding it more difficult to develop the solutions and coverage SMUD needs.

The solution

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The account executive for SMUD, **Christine Palomba**, had previously participated in a presentation from White Rock, a company owned by Aon. White Rock offers numerous reinsurance solutions beyond what we would typically offer. With this background she asked our reinsurance experts, led by Anthony Lathbury, to join the commercial risk team.

With a rich new network of reinsurance contacts and markets, at lower costs, we suddenly had even more options for SMUD. We provided coverage within days, and the client gained the peace of mind to face another season.

"We had teams from Commercial Risk, Insurance, Reinsurance, and White Rock working together to provide the best solution to our client. It's a true demonstration of the superior client service we can provide when we work as one."

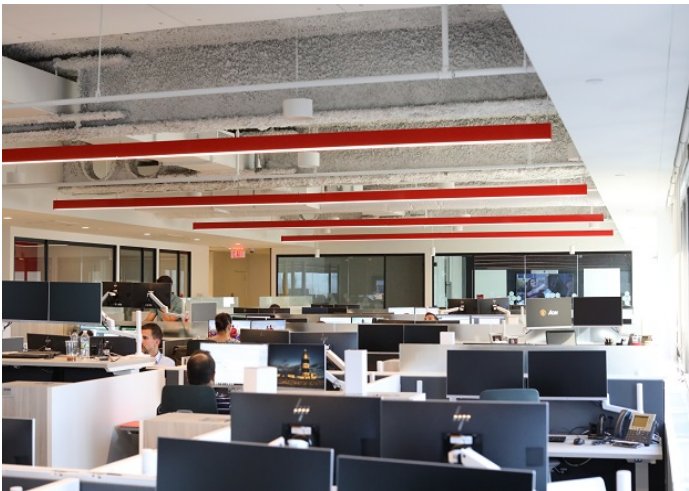
Behind the scenes: How our new NYC hub came together

Over 1,000 colleagues. A high-profile office for client visits and town halls. A flagship home for our firm.

The New York City office is a critical hub for Aon and with the new high-tech, wide-open, full-of-light space at One Liberty Plaza, New York colleagues finally have a space to be productive and collaborative.

It's a place for Aon United to thrive.

Behind the scenes



Some of the most unsung heroes of our firm are the real estate, facilities and technology teams. They are continually moving colleagues around the world into new, better-

equipped offices offering the workplace of the future.

But the NYC move posed a particular challenge for the teams. Over a span of two years, they met with local colleagues and leaders to explore and design what kind of space would help them work.

"We wanted to empower New York colleagues, moving from a location that was 'me' oriented, with private offices and tall cubicle walls, to a space that's now focused on 'we', with tons of conference rooms and spaces to meet," said **Megan Lambert**, Senior Real Estate Analyst.

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In the months leading up to the move in late July and early August, the New York facilities teams were in the new space every day (including weekends),

ensuring the best new home for their fellow colleagues. The entire weekend before the move, teams were guiding the movers, unpacking items, walking the floor to straighten keyboards and ensure wires were in place and monitors working. No detail was left untouched.

The wow factor

And it was perhaps the details that were most impressive when the New York colleagues moved in to One Liberty (165 Broadway).



Colleagues found floors filled with sunlight. They found dozens of conference rooms on every floor, each of which

has wireless sharing. They found efficient printers controlled by their badges and plenty of quiet zones, cafe areas and window seats for intense work. They found an app for their phones that allowed them to instantly reserve conference rooms and help navigate floors to find a colleague. And when they were ready to go home, they found their subway stop beneath the building.

"This has far exceeded my expectations," said **Michele Simak**, Business Operations Manager and member of the colleague council advising the real estate teams. "The planning teams truly paid attention to what our requirements are for a fully functioning work



environment, as well as those extras that make coming to the office a pleasure."

The New York colleagues also found a beautiful new space that honored the past.

Their 9/11 mural is now showcased in the client area as a tribute to the 176 colleagues we lost.

Aon United + Stroz Friedberg

The next step for New York is in September, when the offices will truly house Aon United. Stroz Friedberg colleagues will physically join their Aon colleagues by moving into the 28th floor.

Around the U.S., a similar merging of offices is in progress to integrate our Stroz Friedberg colleagues. In New York, leaders from both organizations will sit together, and colleagues will use the same



client space, internal staircase, and common areas.

"Our move to One Liberty is an opportunity for Stroz colleagues to get to know our

Aon counterparts better, interact more with them, and ultimately drive an Aon United team," said **Antoine Crépin-Héroux**, Cyber Consultant. "This will enable more cross-organization collaboration and will lead to a more unified risk solutions group."

"Then, we engage other teams in the firm to provide our clients the best risk management and insurance options."

We're saving \$25 million in technology costs. Here's how that will help you

We've been doing some renovation that will save Aon \$25 million by the end of next year. Even better? These updates will help you serve your clients faster, and make your days more effective.

What we're updating

In 2016, our technology teams knew our infrastructure and applications, the technology and machines that allow each of us to access the network, collaborate across time zones and serve our clients, badly needed an update. So they embarked on the Americas Data Center (DC) Consolidation project, part of GBS' focus on growth.

Two years in, we're delivering massive technology improvements that will help our firm grow.

"Without updating our core foundation, we couldn't move at the speed of the market," said **Rajeev Khanna**, head of Technology for our Global Business Services (GBS). "This program lets us better deliver business value and stay competitive."

By the time the update is finished in 2019, we'll save US \$25 million per year, money that can be invested back in the business. Plus, through the accelerated investment in the Americas DC Consolidation program, Technology is delivering this in three years, versus the predicted five years!

How we're saving money

The update has been massive, affecting nearly every area of our infrastructure, security and applications. A few examples:

- We will be reducing 29 physical data centers in the U.S., Canada, and LATAM down to only five. This cuts the costs of the shared infrastructure and maintaining massive buildings.
- We've brought in a new private cloud management platform that lets us create a virtual server in hours. Before, servers

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would take up to six weeks to set up, and cost significantly more.

- In total, we've created 4,000 servers in less than a year, something we could previously only do over three years.
- We've created an infrastructure that is secure and compliant, and can quickly respond to any issues or disasters. This prevents the additional costs of recovery.

How this will help improve your work day

A modern technology backbone provides the platform that enables our firm to grow. This also means our technology teams have more time to build new technologies that give us a competitive edge and help you serve your clients.

Plus, you'll have a better experience working with your technology, including:

- Faster tools
- More secure systems
- Reduced outages
- Support teams that can respond to any issues faster

How do we encourage girls towards STEM careers? Aon colleagues work with the next generation



Girls in the Teen-Turn program hard at work in the Aon Dublin office

As more and more data reveals the lack of women in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) fields, Aon offices are tackling the problem at the source.

By partnering with organizations designed to bring more girls and young women into technology, we are helping prepare and equalize the next generation.

Turning teenage girls into tech superstars

This summer, colleagues from **ACIA in Dublin** partnered

with **Teen-Turn**, an organization pairing teenage girls with female mentors via summer internships in Ireland-based STEM companies.

"The ACIA really wanted to be a part of the Teen-Turn experience, to give some young women the opportunity to step up and be part of a STEM environment," said **Yvonne Jacobi**, Chief Operating Officer at ACIA and Teen-Turn mentor. "We want to tap into their energy, enthusiasm, and see how we can contribute to their growth and their development. They've also been helping us with some projects here at the center."

The program gives girls ages 15-16 work experience in real-world technology environments to help them visualize new career paths in STEM. In ACIA our four teens were exposed to multiple aspects of our business: besides learning the fundamentals of coding, data visualization and webpage design, the girls also gained valuable interpersonal, presentation and communication skills throughout their three weeks with us. The Teen-Turn summer internship is often a first exposure to any work environment, and this experience can help teen girls make more informed career choices.

The ACIA mentors were **Yvonne Jacobi**, **Lisa McFarrell**, **Miriam Crowell** and **Katalin Szallor**. In addition, we also brought a larger group of Teen-Turn girls to Inspirefest this summer.

Encouraging young girls to code

In September, a group of Technology and Security colleagues in Krakow led a series of coding classes and workshops for girls ages 9-14 in the **Greenlight 4 Girls Day**. This annual event is meant to demonstrate the fun in science and technology through hands-on workshops, and to inspire young girls to pursue careers in STEM. This was our second year participating.

During workshops, our team helped girls to explore concepts of robotics and coding by linking them to the real-life phenomenon of an earthquake. By using bricks, sensors and motors, girls were introduced to science, computational thinking, and engineering principles, as well as risk management and insurance world in a fun and engaging way.

"IT programming is the future of everything, and encouraging girls at a young age could help grow the ranks of women in STEM," said **Ewa Szulik-Stach**.

Our Krakow team involved also included **Daniel Skrzypiek**, **Magdalena Kozlik** and **Klęga Górńska**.

Helping small farmers build: our new collaboration with Oxfam in Sri Lanka



Small insurance can yield big rewards. That's the idea behind our new collaboration with Oxfam and Etherisc.

By offering micro-insurance to thousands of small holder paddy-field farmers in Sri Lanka, using the power of blockchain technology, we're working to make insurance affordable and easy.

"By bringing micro-insurance, with very small premiums, to these hard-working farmers, we are empowering economic and human possibility," said **Hugo Wegbrans**, Chief Broking Officer in

EMEA. "This is not about making traditional insurance smaller, this is about empowering farmers to manage risk in order to thrive and helping them to recover when they face adversity."

How it works

Oxfam, an organization dedicated to alleviating poverty, has been supporting affordable agricultural insurance to these Sri Lankan farmers for years. By partnering, we can use blockchain tech to expand the program.

A major challenge for these farmers is a lack of affordable and reliable insurance products, along with a lack of understanding on how insurance will help them survive and when it will pay out. Our partnership will transform and simplify the claims process: the farmer won't need to submit a claim and the insurer won't need to send a claims adjuster in the field.

What is Blockchain?

Blockchain was originally designed to support Bitcoin, and has now expanded into other uses. In recent years, the growth of Bitcoin digital currency required a new type of technology.

Think of blockchain as a shared spreadsheet of financial transactions.

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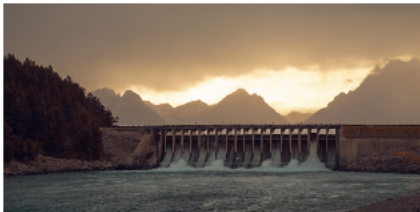

Do our clients have "silent cyber" risk? A new report says yes



Imagine this: An engineer is working on one of the 90,000 dams serving U.S. communities, providing irrigation, hydroelectric power, flood control, and recreation. The engineer is helping the dam's technology systems to work more efficiently.

Meanwhile, a cybercriminal identifies the engineer. Through phishing emails, they gain access to the engineer's system and steal login information. Now, this cybercriminal has full access to the dam's controls.



What happens next could be a financial and environmental disaster, for the community and the owners.

It's an increasingly plausible risk, one we're working to identify with our clients. With the new report, [Silent Cyber Scenario: Opening the Flood Gates](#), we've worked with software provider Guidewire to present the threats and outcomes.

What's at risk?

In a situation like the one above, a dam could be violated in a matter of days. If a cybercriminal, or "threat actor," causes an uncontrolled and unscheduled outflow of water, they could damage equipment and cause major flooding to homes and businesses.

Our report analyzed the potential impact of this kind of cybercrime on three dams, and found economic losses could reach to \$56 billion. However, one scenario found that only 12% of the loss would be insured, highlighting the significant protection gap that would impact homeowners and businesses.

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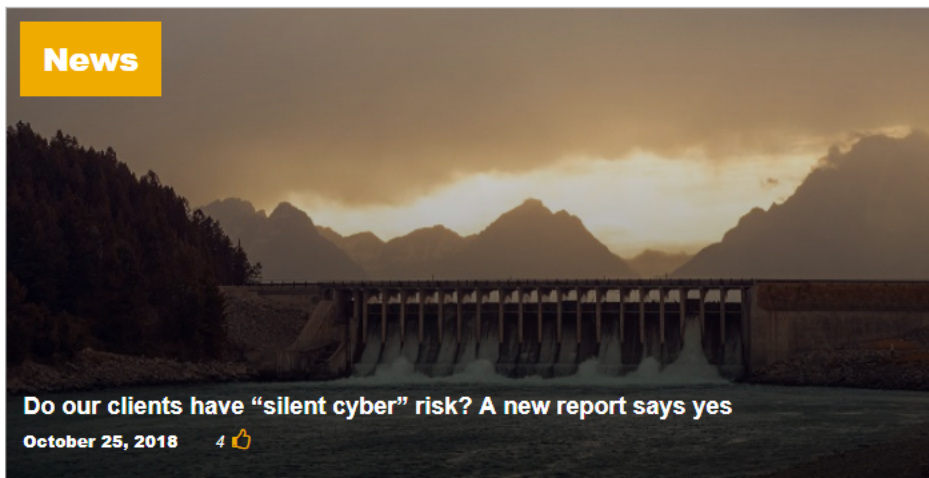

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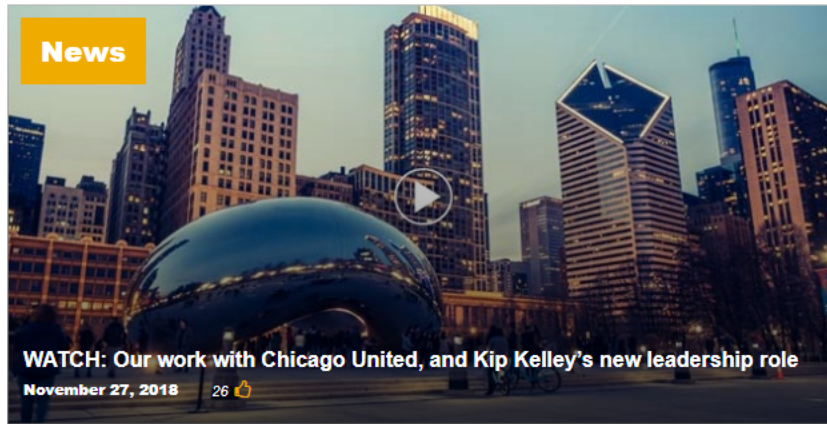
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
